


FIELD TRIP

Color identification was an integral part of the UKG curriculum, allowing young learners to develop their color recognition skills through a variety of engaging activities and exercises.


COUNTING CRAYONS

SHAPE-MATCHING ACTIVITY




लक्ष्य




'बचपन मुरझा रहा, बुढ़ापा दर्द डुबोया' - Hindi and Doodle



Cyber Safety education equips students with the knowledge and skills necessary to navigate online environments securely.

Remember these key points for online safety:

1. Never share personal information online.
2. Create strong passwords for all platforms.
3. Always read the terms and conditions of any site.
4. Avoid responding to emails, texts, or messages from strangers.
5. Do not post or share photos online.
6. Avoid clicking links, opening attachments, or accepting gifts from unknown sources.
7. Never agree to meet someone you've only met online.
8. Set up parental controls to enhance security.
9. Avoid sharing OTPs with anyone.
10. Enable two-factor authentication on your social media platforms.
11. Ensure that site permissions are reasonable before granting access.
12. Avoid entering financial information on any website.
13. Regularly back up your data to protect against breaches.
14. Never share your passwords.

"WHY DO KIDS LIE AND WHAT SHOULD I DO?"

Hi dear parents!
We are back with another special topic, and we invite you to join us on this incredible Odyssey as we navigate the sea of parenthood. So, let's start by understanding why children lie and what you should do if your child lies.

The art of storytelling begins early, it seems, and it's all too common for children to weave their web of make-believe. But why do they do it? And what can we, as parents, learn from these little lies?

LET'S EXPLORE SOME REASONS WHY CHILDREN LIE:

- Lying could be due to fear of punishment.
- They may lie to do something they are not allowed to do.
- Lying might be an attempt to fit in with others.
- Sometimes, they lie for fun.
- They may lie to make someone happy or to avoid hurting others' feelings.

To better understand this, recall situations when you lied for a reason. Lying is an adaptive social strategy that we employ to navigate and control situations where telling the truth may not lead to a positive outcome. Providing unconditional love and acceptance to your child can reduce the inclination to lie.

SO, WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?

- Firstly, let's be calm and change our mode from aggressive to affectionate to make the child comfortable, fostering open communication.
- Create an environment where your child feels at ease discussing their feelings and concerns.
- Praise, appreciate, and reward honesty, even if it means admitting to a mistake.
- Try to find and understand the root cause of why your child is lying and address the underlying issue.
- Be a role model of honesty in your own actions and interactions.
- Help them find better ways to deal with situations instead of lying.
- Finally, explain the consequences and discuss the importance of instilling values like honesty, integrity, and responsibility from a young age with them.

Understanding why children lie is a crucial step in effective parenting. It's essential to recognize that lying is a natural part of a child's development, often driven by curiosity, imagination, or fear. By fostering open communication, parents can guide their children toward a truthful and responsible future.

PARENTS' PERSPECTIVE


I AM THE PARENT OF SHASHKETH, GRADE 9 AND SURYATEHA, GRADE 7
